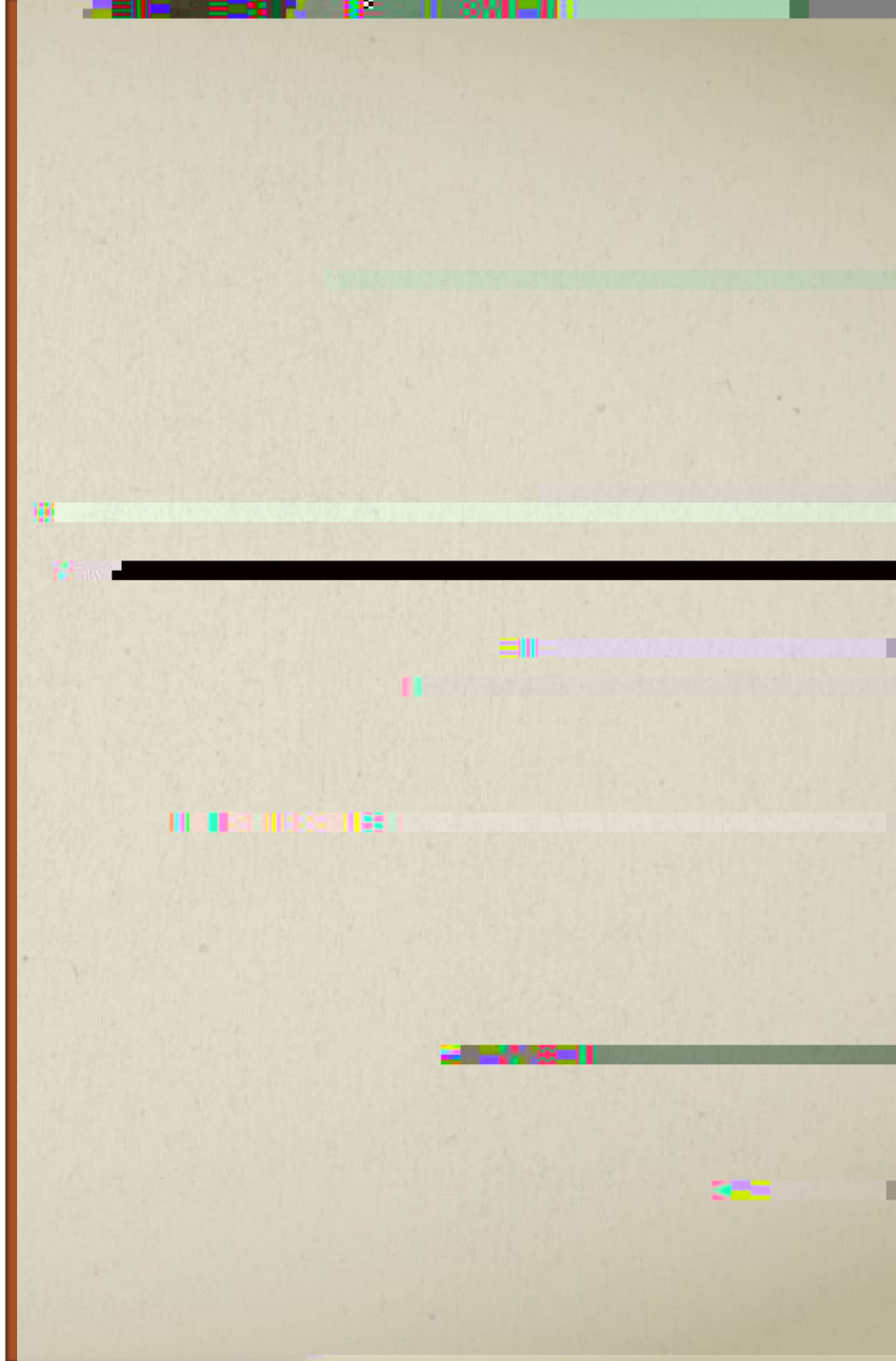

SHS Needs and Program Description

Safe and Healthy Students: The needs assessment indicated that a large portion of Example CSD's students need more support to navigate life trauma and to reduce bullying and harassment in and out of school. The SHS funding will be focused on building capacity within the district's school-based health and mental health services by adding Trauma-Informed Care Counselors and preventing bullying and harassment programs.
